Kindergarteners enter kindergarten at various levels. Here is a suggested list of some skills that can help upcoming kindergarteners strengthen prerequisite knowledge that can assist in providing a foundation for future concepts.

- recognize and name basic shapes: square, circle, triangle, and rectangle
- recognize and name numbers 1-10, even when they are out of order

- count to 20
- count 10 objects, pointing to each one as she counts
- say or sing the alphabet
- recognize the letters of the alphabet, both uppercase and lowercase (even out of order)
- identify colors in an 8-ct crayon pack
- recognize her first name
- write her first name
- sort items by size, color, or shape
- hold a book and turn pages
- tell if two words rhyme
- identify some letter sounds
- say parents' full names and phone numbers (at least one)
